On July 31, 2021, our community lost a longstanding employee much too soon. Among her many roles throughout her 40 years at Floyd Memorial Hospital, **Diane Ballard** served as the first executive director of the Floyd Memorial Foundation for six years. At that time, the Foundation had \$50,000 in the bank. During her tenure, Diane was instrumental in increasing donations and donors to support hospital programs and equipment. She retired from the Foundation and the hospital in 1999, only to move on to other positions at a neighboring hospital and museum in the Bloomington area. She will forever be remembered for her caring and pleasant disposition and giving 110% no matter her responsibilities. In a recent conversation with her sister, **Linda Hendrich**, also a former Foundation Executive Director, she stated that Diane, upon accepting the executive director position in 1993, was instrumental in better organizing and streamlining the fundraising efforts to support the Foundation's mission and goals.

Diane leaves behind many friends and hospital colleagues throughout Southern Indiana who will cherish her memory along with her children, Dana and Doug (Janet), four grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, and her sister, Linda.

Foundation Supports SANE Certification



For many years, Floyd Memorial Foundation has provided grant support to train Emergency Department employees to become Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANEs). These specialized, dedicated registered nurses provide specialized care for patients who are experiencing acute and long-term health consequences due to abuse and sexual violence. In addition, they provide consultation and testimony

for civil and criminal proceedings relative to nursing practice, care provided, and opinions rendered regarding findings.

Forensic nursing care is not separate and distinct from other forms of medical care, but rather integrated into the overall care needs of individual patients.

According to the International Association of Forensic Nurses, "Victims of violence and abuse require care from a health professional who is trained to treat the trauma associated with the wrong that has been done to them—whether it be sexual assault, intimate partner violence, neglect, or other forms of intentional injury. Forensic nurses are a critical resource for anti-violence efforts. They collect evidence and give testimony that can be used in a court of law to apprehend or prosecute perpetrators who commit violent and abusive acts."

These experienced nurses work collaboratively with the victim, the family, law enforcement and community agencies to ensure and instill measures for the protection of our most vulnerable community members.

Floyd Memorial Foundation is honored to support them and appreciates the challenging work they encounter as they continue to provide the best care for our community.

VACA Growing Guardianship Services Throughout Floyd County

Vulnerable Adult Care Advocates (VACA) was a collaborative idea from concerned citizens, including clinicians, court representatives and assisted living representatives, to best support incapacitated adults and the senior community in Floyd County. The idea was to help senior citizens with dementia or other incapacities make challenging decisions through the legal guardianship process. VACA utilizes certified volunteers to check on their assigned person on a weekly/bi-weekly basis to provide companionship, help navigate complicated medical decisions, pay bills, as well as update the program director on any changes to medication and/or status.

Since its inception in 2020, VACA has now been able to serve 17 incapacitated adults in Floyd County and has been asked to expand into Harrison and Jefferson Counties in Indiana, making a total of 26 people who have received services. The list continues to grow. Guardianship training has extended to family members interested in supporting their relatives effectively and appropriately.

Floyd Memorial Foundation was honored to provide initial grant funding to support this grassroots organization to aid patients and other community members with difficult and sometimes life-altering decisions. The Foundation continues to provide support to ensure vulnerable citizens have protective resources to ensure the best choices are being made to preserve their health, their home, and their livelihood.

In 2021, Floyd Memorial Foundation received generous contributions from two local, dedicated partnering charities to support its efforts to establish a Level II Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Baptist Health Floyd. **Kosair Charities** generously awarded \$299,274 towards purchasing supplies and equipment for this vital initiative. **WHAS Crusade for Children** provided grant funding for the purchase of state-of-the-art bassinets and a PANDA warmer for a future NICU.



As supplies have been purchased, they are implemented and utilized to treat babies born with emergent or critical issues to avoid transporting them across the river to a Louisville, KY-based hospital.

We are so thankful to these generous organizations for their kind and continued partnership and dedication to ensure Southern Indiana families have necessary healthcare resources available to their newborn children at Baptist Health Floyd.

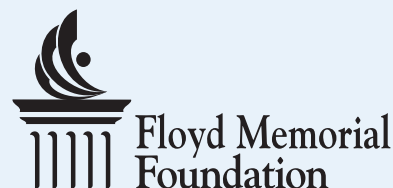

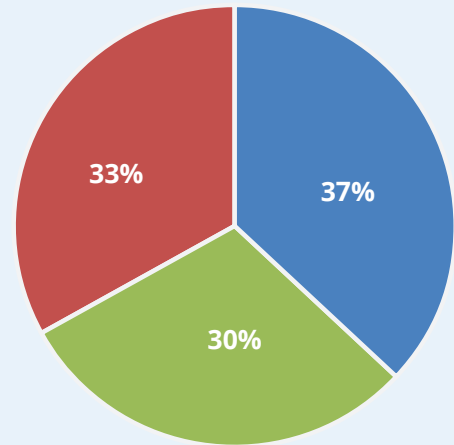

Baptist Health Floyd Grant Support
